The extensive schedule of events offered tools for all levels of learning with thirty seminars covering topics such as: Launching a Podcast, Getting Amazon Reviews, Marketing to Schools, Building a Fan Base, Book Distribution, Selling to Children, Funding, Metadata, and so much more! Getting Your Book into the Local Library Sincere thanks to Jennifer Alexander, Collection Development Specialist

for St. Louis County Library (SLCL) and our featured speaker for the July 10 meeting. Each library system has its own selection criteria. Here's what can give you a head start with SLCL:





Reader Influence

Library response to patrons' interests are local to the region, sometimes down to specific neighborhoods. Attend local book club events in your genre to connect with readers.

Quality

Whether hard copy, e-book or audio book, it should look and/or sound like it belongs in the library, i.e. professionally produced with materials able to withstand long-term wear and tear.

Introducing Your Book to the Library

SLCL uses an online form on its website to suggest titles for purchase. Review the Collection Development Policy and follow the guidelines. A "no" to a library purchase request isn't forever. After an initial refusal to The Block Manager (featured in the SLPA May 2019 newsletter), multiple requests by area patrons following a successful launch event and strong publicity caused the Library to reconsider. It is <u>now available at several</u> SLCL locations.

Biggest takeaway

Do your research. Know local audience interests. Adjust as needed and go for it; your book could be on local library shelves next!
