f you enjoy reading—no matter the type of book or genre—there's a book club for you. Whether organized through the local library, place of worship, community center, or as a group formed among co-workers and friends, the common thread all book clubs share is bringing people together who enjoy reading and want to engage in meaningful conversation. As an author, how can you receive an invitation to be interviewed and have your book featured on their reading list? At our October 9 meeting, we'll explore what you should know about book clubs: rules about self-promotion, invitation and selection criteria, membership benefits, and more.



Gina Gibbons is the director at the **Brentwood** Public Library. Previously she worked at the St. Louis County Library in the ordering department, on a school bookmobile, and in the reference department of the late,

great Tesson Ferry branch as an assistant manager. For the past ten years she has facilitated the Brentwood Book Club, which covers multiple genres in both fiction and non-fiction. It averages about 15 members and meets the second Tuesday of each month. The Resolutions Book Club meets

every other month, covering books about how to create good habits while breaking bad ones, in pursuit of achieving personal goals set during the beginning of the year.

Damita Morris is a retired supply chain professional with degrees in Sociology and Business Administration. As a charter member of the Shalom Church City of Peace Book Club Ministry



that began in 2011, she has served as its leader for the past six years. Their mission is "To

inspire reading and the discussion of literary works that vary in genre, while building knowledge and providing an atmosphere that promotes unity and a sense of community while having fun." The Shalom Book Club has 20 members on its active roster and meets on the third Monday of the month, February through November.

# LAST MONTH'S RECAP: YouTube for Authors

Everyone goes to YouTube in search of *something*. Establish a consistent process so people can find your videos as a match for their search.



#### **Define Your Goals**

Do you want to increase your reach and impact readers? Make money? Build your mailing list? Or do you just want to have fun? The *why* directs your *how*.

#### Research

Study popular sites that interest you. What do you like/dislike? What do they have in common (titles, graphics, music, script templates)? Use a key word search on your topic to see if it matches what you had in mind, if not, adjust.

#### Setup

Pay attention to details and be consistent (thumbnails, title themes and images should complement each other). Establish a template for each video—title, intro, invite to subscribe, content, call to action (like, share, purchase, register), reminder to subscribe.

#### **Action Steps**

Publish often and regularly (once a week or every other weekend). Try different titles to see what brings the best response. Double down on what works and revise what doesn't.
