LAST MONTH'S RECAP: Book Clubs – What Every Author and Self-Publisher Should Know

Thanks again to Gina Gibbons, director at the Brentwood Public Library, Damita Morris, leader of the Shalom Church City of Peace Book Club Ministry, and SLPA board member Jo Lena Johnson for an eye-opening discussion. Special thanks to John Grayshaw, director of the Middletown Pennsylvania Public Library and founder of the 5,000 member Science Fiction Book Club on Facebook. Although not physically present, he contributed valuable insights.

Reasons to Join

- Be a fan first! People join clubs because of a shared interest in reading and active discussion.
- High interest books often feature gripping narratives, drama, relationship tension, or popular topics.
- If a library selects your book, it will purchase several copies for the permanent catalogue.

Invitation/Selection Criteria

- Research! What did the club read in the past 1-2 years? Does your book fit in that group?
- Selection may come from member recommendations or the leader may present to the group for a final vote. Reach out to the leader for details.
- Libraries prefer high-quality, professional looking books. A verifiable review source increases your chances for consideration.

• Most clubs make their selections early, for the entire year (3-12 months out, plan accordingly).

Common Problems That Lead to Rejection

- Inundated with self-promoting authors or book marketers.
- Members not interested in group discussion about other's work.
- Promotors only join to push their own agenda.
- Bad behaviors equivalent to self-centered conversation hogs, a major turnoff.

Need feedback for your work? Join a writer's club (submit your book for critique, read other authors work, and do the same for them). For beneficial results, demonstrate a sincere interest in the purpose of the group—whether it's a book club or writer's club—and actively participate without self-promotion.
